## THE PROBLEM

Bottom line, residents of Appalachia are less likely to seek medical care which contributes to the following **shocking** statistics:

- The Appalachian Region has a **higher** mortality rate than the national average for seven of the ten leading causes of death in the United States:
  - Heart Disease
  - Cancer
  - Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
  - Injury
  - Stroke,
  - Diabetes,
  - and Suicide.
- Every mortality indicator is **higher** in the Appalachian Region than national averages:
  - Heart Disease 17%
  - Cancer is 10%
  - COPD is 27%
  - Injury is 33%
  - Stroke is 14%
  - Diabetes is 11%.

**Not only is the cancer mortality rate 10% higher than the rest of the nation, in Central Appalachia, it is an alarming 32% higher.**

John scheduled a critical appointment with a local urologist and was diagnosed with prostate cancer. Despite the doctor's insistence, John refused to return for treatments. Over the next few years, his symptoms worsened forcing him to seek help at Duke University Hospital. Unfortunately, it was too late for John.
